Dance Class Learning Objectives

The dance classes each fall aim to help students feel prepared for the musical audition so the classes themselves will be a fun exploration of dance styles from *Matilda*. Each week, we start with a warm up, technique review, and skill building. The second half the class is focused on learning a combination similar to the style in the show or with a song directly pulled from the score. There will be a heavy focus on jumps and leaps, musicality, and learning to dance as a single unit. Because of the jump and leap techniques taught, ankle weights are recommended but not required!
